To ensure that you get the best out of your time with us, we have compiled a short guide/tips for studio shoots:

Tips on clothing and accessories.

- Very simple garments photograph best. Style of clothing is probably more important than colour.
- Try to choose lighter colours and those which will contrast with your partner's. Avoid black where possible as of all the dark colours, blacks tend to blend into the background too much and then there is little separation between you and the background.
- Turtle or V-necks are flattering provided that neither is exaggerated in style.
- Try to avoid logos/brands and bold patterns on clothing, as it may "date" the images.
- For the classic look, long sleeves are good for teens and adults, as bare arms naturally draw the viewer's attention and often overpower the face. Although in summer this can look good with dresses.
- We will be taking full length shots, so attention should be paid to legs and shoes. Try to avoid any footwear which is too bulky.

If there is somewhere to change at the venue, then a smart casual look and perhaps a more formal change of clothes is a good combination.

I am delighted that you have chosen to have an engagement shoot and this is a chance for us to get to know each other, so remember to relax and enjoy it..... By the end of it you will be experts in posing and having your photo taken!

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
